Cremation or Burial

In many cases a loved one will have left their own specific preference. Once the decision for a cremation or burial has been made, a venue for the service and order of events can be agreed upon.

Chapel of Rest

Our private chapel is available for you to spend time with your loved one, also allowing your relatives and friends the chance to say "goodbye".

Date and Time

Following registration, a date and time can then be arranged.

The Funeral Service

We will liaise with the Clergy, Humanist Minister or Celebrant of your choice. Alternatively, if no specific Minister is requested we can suggest a Minister who will guide you through the order of service. The readings, hymns and eulogies will all be discussed.

Funeral Options

Not too long ago, there was really only one type of funeral service. With Britain being more diverse than ever, funeral formats are far less rigid than previously.

From dress codes to music, flowers to vehicles, the type of funeral you have has become much more a reflection of the individual rather than dictated by tradition. There's a much wider variety of funeral options today, giving you an opportunity to have a more bespoke send off.

If you are unsure on what kind of funeral you would like to arrange, here are the most popular types to help you decide.

Traditional Funerals

Most funerals taking place in the UK would be considered as traditional. A traditional funeral service can either be held in a local church or a crematorium and then either followed by a burial or cremation.

Broadly speaking, a traditional funeral service will be a religious service taken by either a Church of England vicar, a Catholic father, a Methodist minister or any other religious denomination.

Celebrant or Humanist Funerals

A celebrant or humanist funeral, is a non-religious ceremony for either a cremation or burial service which is becoming increasingly common.

This can be more appropriate for those who neither believed or lived according to religious principles, nor accepted religious views of life or death.

Direct Cremations

Direct cremation funerals are for families or individuals who want a very simple, straight forward funeral that requires minimal organisation and is less expensive than other types of funerals. Following initial contact with your funeral director, the coffin will be transported to a crematorium on a date and time arranged on your behalf. No family members will be present at the cremation due to no service being held.

Green Funerals

Green funerals are becoming increasingly popular, as families or individuals consider a more environmentally friendly way of arranging a funeral.

This can range from planning a whole green funeral or considering certain aspects of a green funeral to incorporate into a traditional funeral, such as the choice of coffin or having a green burial.

The goal of a natural burial is to return the body to the earth in the most efficient natural process. Green burials are intended as an environmentally sustainable alternative to existing funeral practices such as cremation which is very carbon intensive.

Procedure To Be Followed After A Death

All deaths in the community, except those that are clear coroner referrals, must be referred to the medical examiner's office. A medical practitioner can complete a Medical Certificate of Cause of Death (MCCD) if they attended the deceased in their lifetime.

The GP must send the completed MCCD to the medical examiner's office, who will then sign and send it to the Registrar. The medical examiner will independently scrutinize the case. They will also speak with the bereaved to answer any questions they have.

The medical examiner's role is to:

- · Determine the cause of death · Decide if the coroner needs to be notified
- · Assess the appropriateness of care before death

When The Death Occurs At Home

Inform the family Doctor as soon as possible that death has occurred. They will complete a Medical Certificate of Cause of Death and send it to the medical examiner's office.

When The Death Occurs In A Hospice Or Nursing Home

The staff of the hospice or nursing home will support you in obtaining the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death and will care for your loved one until they are conveyed to our funeral home in a dignified and caring manner.

When The Death Occurs In Hospital

The bereavement services department of the hospital will assist you in obtaining the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death via the hospital. Your loved one will remain in the hospital mortuary until the death has been registered. Once this has taken place, we will make arrangements to convey your loved one into our care.

When The Death Is Referred To The Coroner

Sometimes the Coroner will need to be informed when a Doctor or medical examiner cannot issue the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death.

In these circumstances the Coroner's Office will most likely produce a certificate once the cause of death has been established. This will then enable the funeral arrangements to proceed and the death to be legally registered.

Registering A Death – Who May Register?

The medical examiner's office will notify the representative of the deceased that the Registrar's appointment can go ahead. Informants must register deaths within five days of the medical examiner's office sending the completed MCCD to the register office.

Documents & Information You Will Need

Documents

When registering a death you will need the following:

- Medical Certificate of the Cause of Death And if available:
- · Council Tax bill · Driving Licence · Passport
- \cdot Proof of Address \cdot Birth Certificate \cdot NHS Medical Card
- · Marriage / Civil Partnership Certificate

Information you will need to tell the Registrar:

- The person's full name at time of death Any names previously used (e.g. maiden name) The person's date and place of birth Their last address Their occupation
- The full name, date of birth and occupation of a surviving spouse, late spouse or civil partner • Whether they were receiving a State Pension or any other benefit

Tell Us Once

Tell Us Once is a service that lets you report a death to most government organisations in one go.

Tell Us Once will notify: • HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) • Department for Work and Pensions (DWP)

· Passport Office · Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) · The Local Council · Veterans UK

Life Ledger

Life Ledger is a free, easy-to-use service that notifies 750 companies of a death from one place simplifying the admin for bereaved families. The Life Ledger platform allows families to contact all of the businesses connected with the deceased from a single point, removing the need to have the same difficult conversation over and over.

From banks and utilities; to insurance companies and loyalty cards. They help families to simplify the administrative burden around the death of a loved one. They also offer an estate planning process to encourage individuals to list all their lifetime accounts and information to make it easy for loved ones to handle the administration when they die.

Documents You Will Receive

If a post-mortem is not being held, the Registrar will issue you with:

- Certificate for Burial or Cremation (Green Form) Given to the funeral director as soon as possible
- Certificate of Registration of Death (White Form) Known as a BD8, this form is for DWP purposes
- · Death Certificate

A certified copy of the entry into the register

If a post-mortem is being held to determine the cause of death and the deceased is to be cremated, the Coroner will issue a Form 6 Certificate to the Funeral Director.

FAQ's

In our opinion there is no such thing as a normal funeral. Each and every funeral is individual to the family concerned. It is up to that family to pay their last respects and say their last farewell in the manner that is most suitable for them. The following information is there to help answer questions that we are most often asked about the funeral and services associated with it:-

(Q). How Many People Can Be Seated In The Limousine?

(A). In each limousine there is room for six people in the rear compartment and room for one in the front.

(Q). How Do We Know What To Do At The Funeral?

(A). On the day of the funeral we are there to help and guide you, your family and friends. If you are unsure of anything please tell the Funeral Director.

(Q). Can The Family Carry The Coffin?

(A). Yes, although we would ask that you contact us as soon as possible to ensure that it is safe to do so.

(Q). Can We Visit The Deceased And Pay Our Last Respects?

(A). Yes, our Funeral Home is available to you by appointment. If you wish to visit our private chapel, please ring and inform us when you would like to come and we will be pleased to arrange for a member of staff to meet you.

(Q). Can We Choose What Music Is Played At The Crematorium?

(A). Yes, If you have a special request or would like a particular piece of music playing either as you walk into or out of the Crematorium Chapel, please let the Funeral Director know.

(Q). Can We Request Donations To Charity?

(A). Yes, if donations to charity are requested in lieu of flowers, we will accept and list donations on your behalf and forward them to the charity of your choice.

(Q). Does The Coffin Move After The Funeral Service At The Crematorium?

(A). No. After the service has ended, the coffin does not move until all relatives and friends have left the Crematorium Chapel.

At some Crematoria there are curtains that close at the head of the coffin, but this is only done at the request of the relatives.

(Q). Are The Handles On The Coffin Removed Before The Cremation Takes Place?

(A). No. There are strict laws regarding cremation. Nothing may be removed from the coffin before cremation without the permission of the Home Office.

(Q). Is Each Cremation Carried Out Individually?

(A). Yes. The identity of the coffin name plate is checked by the Crematorium Attendant before it is placed in the Cremation Chamber. This only holds one coffin or casket at a time and again there are rules that must be abided by.

(Q). Do I Get The Cremated Remains Back That Belong To Me?

(A). Yes. Once the cremation has taken place, the cremated remains are removed and left to cool before being placed in an urn. This urn is clearly identified as to whose remains they are.

(Q). Can We Have The Deceased Brought Home?

(A). Yes, we can bring the deceased home either on the evening before the service or the morning of the service.

(Q). What Can I Do With The Cremated Remains?

- You can place them in the Garden of Remembrance but you may not know where they are and you can not place a headstone with them.
- You may wish to purchase a grave just for the purpose of interring the cremated remains. This allows you to have a headstone and have other members of the family buried there in the future.
- You may keep them at home in a special urn or memorial.
- 4. You may scatter them in a special place.
- 5. The remains may be buried in an existing family grave.
