Accessing technology



Overnight care support

Everybody is different and each situation is unique, which is why our overnight care is tailored to you. With a dedicated night-time carer, help is available at any time.

There are two types of overnight care:

Sleeping night care

A carer is available in case of need, but they don't need to be awake and alert at all times. This care is best for those who are mostly settled during the night but, for instance, may need help with toileting during the night.

Waking night care

If your loved one requires closer supervision, a waking night carer will be awake all night, either sitting in the room, or staying alert in a room nearby, whatever the preference.


